# Dar es Salaam Tanzania 18-22 November 2002

# Hosted by: Tanzania Civil Aviation Authority

The Tanzania Civil Aviation Authority (TCAA) and the ICAO Regional office in Nairobi, Kenya invited the Reachout committee to deliver a workshop in Dar es Salaam at the Sea Cliff Hotel. A three day accident investigation workshop was held, followed by a two day workshop on safety management systems. The Tanzania Civil Aviation Authority arranged for local sponsorship and produced all support for the workshop including participant bags, nametags, lunches and refreshment breaks.

## **Seminar Opening**

The Sixth ISASI Reachout Workshop was officially opened by Tanzania's Minister for Communications and Transport, Professor Mark Mwandosya, who called upon the concerned authorities in the aviation industry and the global community to pay special attention to the improvement of aviation safety, particularly in Africa. The acting Director General TCAA, Mr. Wilfred Malisa and Mr. Jim Stewart on behalf of ISASI also welcomed to participants during the opening ceremony.

#### **Participants**

Seventy four participants from 11 African countries attended the full workshop. Countries represented included Botswana, Ethiopia, Kenya, Madagascar, Malawi, Somalia, South Africa, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia and Zimbabwe as well as three participants representing the World Food Program based in Angola, Afghanistan and Kenya.

#### The Workshop Schedule

Instructors included Jim Stewart, Chairman, ISASI Reachout, Caj Frostell and Negussie Kumelachew from ICAO, Andre de Kock from South Africa CAA and John Nyamwihura from Tanzania CAA.

Work started on Saturday with a two hour meeting with the TCAA DGCA, Mrs. M.T. Munyagi and senior staff followed by detailed workshop planning between instructors and the hosts. On Monday to Wednesday, sessions started at 8:00 am and were complete by 5:00 pm. Thursday and Friday sessions started at 09:00 am and ran to 5:00 pm.

#### **Delegate Materials**

Instructors prepared their own training material consisting of paper handouts, CD-ROM libraries and published manuals and booklets.

Participant products such as nametags were produced by the hosts as was the workshop certificate.

At the end of the workshop ISASI scrolls of appreciation were presented to TCAA and the ICAO Nairobi office. All participants received an attendance scroll which was produced by TCAA.

**TCAA** was the host and primary sponsor of the workshop. They provided air travel for two instructors, arranged for instructor accommodation, provided all coffee breaks and lunches during the workshop and provided continual administrative and staff support. Eight TCAA staff members were assigned to organizing and supporting the workshop. In all, planning by the TCAA covered nine months.

The ISASI Reachout Committee wants to recognize the outstanding contributions made to the success of Reachout Tanzania by those staff from TCAA who worked so hard on its success.

#### **ICAO**

Working with ICAO proved essential to the success of the Tanzania workshop. The Nairobi office of ICAO plans to use the success of Reachout Tanzania to encourage other Reachout workshops in Africa. With no dedicated seminar budget, the ICAO staff sees ISASI Reachout as a viable and effective training option.

### **Social Program**

There was a reception organized by the hosts at the end of the workshop. Beyond that there was no social program associated with Reachout Tanzania.
