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## Activities Since the last International Council Meeting or Future Events No Action ( )

In accordance with the plans I described in my last annual report, I established a new online forum / collaborative workspace (isasihfworkinggroup.slack.com) in September 2021 to incorporate a wider cross-section of the ISASI membership into HF working group activities. This new workspace has 23 members, several topical discussion channels, and 7 discussion subgroups for members affiliated with: (1) aircraft manufacturers, (2) aircraft operators, (3) consultants and independent experts, (4) civil accident investigation agencies, (5) military organizations, (6) research organizations, and (7) unions and employee organizations. I appointed a moderator for each subgroup who comes from that respective sector, and I asked each moderator to add any interested ISASI member who comes from their particular sector of the industry to their subgroup's discussion channel, and to the general discussion channel for the overall group. The subgroup moderators are:

3. Rayhana Yasin, Independent Consultant, South Africa
4. Katherine Wilson, US NTSB
5. Glenn Pinnuck, Australian Defence Force

7. Felix Chen, Singapore Airlines

This workspace laid the groundwork for future online collaboration across time zones, and it provides a means for wider member involvement that allows members to share information and discuss HF issues in their unique functional contexts, as well as broader, cross-cutting issues. After an initial flurry of activity, and with the resurgence of covid last winter, interactions on the workspace died off, and not much interaction has occurred so far in 2022. To spur renewed activity, I will develop an article for ISASI forum later this year that incorporates a brief write-up from each moderator

describing their HF-related role in their organization and alert other ISASI members to the availability of the HF Slack workspace.
