ISASI REACHOUT 38 REPORT DARWIN AUSTRALIA 25 to 28 October 2011

New ground was broken down under when Reachout 38 was held in Darwin, Australia between 25th and 28th October 2010. This 'Outback' environment was significant in that it was well away from the beaten track and in keeping with the Reachout philosophy of taking the training to areas that would otherwise have not been available to many attendees.

Twenty delegates represented the breadth of the industry in the Northern Territory.
